COPPER CLIFF MINOR HOCKEY ASSOCIATION KEN CREASEY HOUSE LEAGUE TOURNAMENT 2010 HOUSE LEAGUE TOURNAMENT RULES

1. All games will be played under N.O.H.A. rules
2. Games will consist of 3 periods, 10-10-10 stop time periods.
3. The time clock will be left running during the third period if the difference in the score is 5 goals or more.
4. All players eligible to play in the tournament must be on an approved roster list.
5. In the event of a tie within your group in the standings the following tie-breaking formula will be used:
 - (a) The winner of the group game between the two teams advances.
 - (b) In the event that the group game ended in a tie, or if 3 teams tie at the conclusion of group play, the winner will be decided as follows: for each team, add the goals for and the goals against, then divide the sum into the totals for. The winner is the team with the higher percentage.
 - (c) If still tied, the team with the least penalty minutes in-group play advances.
 - (d) If still tied, the team with the earliest goal in the tournament advances.
 - (e) If still tied, a coin toss by a tournament official will determine the winner.

REGULATION (All Tied Games)

Three time periods to be played with stop time.

No change of end at the end of regulation time.

All tied games will be decided by each team starting the overtime with (4) skaters and a goalie.

After one minute, the horn will blow and each team will withdraw one (1) more player from the ice.

This process shall continue each minute until the tie is broken. The first goal wins the game.

PENALTIES

Penalties will be at two minutes stop time.

Penalties carry over into overtime. If a penalty occurs during the four (4) verses four (4) portion of the overtime, then the penalized team play three (3) skaters verses four (4) skaters until the penalty has expired. If a penalty occurs during the three (3) verses three (3) portion of the overtime, then the penalized team play two (2) skaters verses three (3) skaters until the penalty has expired. In the event of more than one penalty being assessed to a team during overtime, then the team shall play with not less than three (2) skaters and a goalie. The non-penalized team adds a player. At any time during overtime a team may pull their goalie for an additional skater.

In the championship games each Team shall be allowed one (1) second time out. (Championship games only.)

Team Managers must report to the tournament officials at the arena where their first game is scheduled at least 1 hour prior to the game for registration.

6. All teams must be prepared to play 15 minutes in advance of their scheduled game time.
7. A maximum of 19 players per team will be allowed to sign the game sheet.
8. Any player or team official that receives a GROSS MISCONDUCT anytime during a game will be suspended for the next 2 tournament games. Any player or team official receiving a MISDETERMINED anytime during a game will be suspended from all further tournament participation. This suspension will be separate from any suspension subsequently issued by the N.O.H.A.
9. Interpretation of the rules and regulations will be at the discretion of the tournament committee. All committee decisions will be final.
10. BNQ throat guards are mandatory for all players.
11. The NOHA adopted a policy position at its Annual General Meeting in May, 2004 for the mandatory use of intra-oral mouthguard protection by each player participating in a Northern Ontario Hockey Association game and or practice.
12. Intra-Oral mouthguard protection is mandatory for all players.
13. No protests allowed. Referee decisions are final.
14. Tournament Committee reserves the right to amend tournament rules if required.
